



- 178 cities in 56 countries, carrying on average a total of 168 million passengers per day (2017).
- Total annual ridership of about 54 billion passengers, almost 8 times the global population.

Metros and cultural life in cities


- Metro areas are by far the busiest public places in large metropolitan areas.

Ancient art in display: Athens metro










The Arts et Métier station, Paris metro. Inspired by Jules Verne's submarine "Nautilus"
