Spooked by virus, Watson, Etches nix trick-or-treat

Mayor says there won't be candy cops; top doctor says be like Easter

Dr. Vera Etches couldn't be more clear Wednesday: there should be no trick-or-treating this Halloween in Ottawa.

een in Ottawa. Etches, the city's medical officer of health, told city council that she doesn't recommend kids go door-to-door on Oct. 31 since Ottawa has

to-door on Oct. 31 since Ottawa has the highest rate of people testing positive for COVID-19 in Ontario. The city, she emphasized, is in the red zone when it comes to the spread of the novel coronavirus and the city card led down its guard on physical distancing. What to do about Halloween emerged as a popular topic for council members as Etches fielded questions for a large portion of

a council meeting.

Etches said Halloween should
only be celebrated within households and she suggested it should
be more like Easter, perhaps involving costumed hunts for candy

"Halloween needs to be different this year," Etches said.

Mayor Jim Watson said bylaw officers and police won 'tbe cracking
down on trick-or-treaters. It's just
a strong recommendation from

Watson said he won't be handing

Councillors were also trying
to reconcile the messages from
Etches with those from federal

chief public health officer Theresa Tam, who suggested this week that trick-or-treating could be done safely.

But, as Etches pointed out, Tam also said people should listen to their local medical officers of health for advice.

Etches spent nearly three hours answering questions from councilors about the COVID-19 situation in Ottawa, with politicians prob-

lors about the COVID-19 situation in Ottawa, with politicians probing her thoughts on Hallowen, sources of virus transmission and the recent economic restrictions forced on the city by the provincia government.

Council pressed Etches on the province's decision to ban indoor dining and the operation of fitness centres for at least 28 days, starting last Saturday, It was a decision she said she supported in light of the increase in virus transmissions.

The placement of new emergency shelter clients at two properties run by a Vanier hotel owner—whose arrangement with the city previously faced scrutiny by the office of the auditor general—has been temporarily suspended while the city investigates concerns about poor living conditions. The city's one-of-a-kind arrangement with the Ottawa Inan dits owner, Ahmed Syed has been in place for five years.

Ottawa police Chief Peter Sloly said the force will continue to review how decisions are made to execute a "dynamic entry" in tactical raids. The comments come on the heels of the falling death of 23 year-old Anthony Aust who jumped from his bedreom window on Ct. 7 af-

The Special Investigations Unit continues to probe Aust's falling death and has designated three

subject officers in the probe. The watchdog investigates any inci-dents of death, serious injury or sexual assault involving police and civilians in Ontario. Sloly did not speak to the specifics of the Aust case. Police forces are prohibited from discussing cases being inves-tigated by the SIU. As reported by the Citizen, a

Video from a security camera in the apartment shows that once the door was open, masked tactical officers announced their presence — "Police! Aust was asleep in his bedroom on a bunk bed at the time, according to his prother. Het then jumped from the 12th-floor bedroom wing to his prothing to catch him. His family believes the stress of the police entry led him to jump.

The entry, in which police break down adoor, sometimes using abat-tering ram, and use flash grenades as distraction devices, remains legal for police to use in Ontario.

In February, an Ottawa judge chastised what she called the ser-vice's overuse of the entry, saying it amounted to "casual disregard" of people's constitutional rights. That ruling, however, didn't pro-hibit police from continuing to use the entry.
